Questions to Ponder

When do you find it difficult to trust God's plans?

What caught your attention from our scripture today?

- Why do you think you are drawn here?
- What do you think God is saying to you?

How does it strike you that Jesus intentionally waits before going to see Lazarus?

- In what ways was this "the better" rather than responding immediately?
- What might it mean in your life that Jesus is both the God of "11:59" (just in time) and "12:29" (we are waiting...where were you)?

- Why would he respond this way?
- What might this be telling us concerning our relationship with Jesus?

- God is strong enough to protect you as you follow His best for your life.
